Thank you so much for your ministry, love and support for our family and church.

By the grace of God, our life is extended so that we can still work in God's vineyard. Although it became restless around us and there were some restrictions associated with the epidemic, we are still alive. Last time I introduced you to a little a military man named Victor, who came to our church and I asked you to pray for him. He was on a duty trip in the conflict zone. Praise God he returned safely.

Last Sunday we had a baptism where two people, including Victor, were baptized. The glory belongs to our Lord. In our slightly challenging environment, we continue to engage in evangelism every Sunday, displaying paintings by renowned artists and handing out brochures and New Testaments. We bought 1,000 masks and put the brochure "How to Know God" in a bag and we distribute them in the park or near our church.

A month ago, I was invited to a military unit, where I had the opportunity to answer questions from the commanders for two hours. All this time their chief officer was also sitting at the table, and at the end of our meeting he turned to his subordinates and said, "This is exactly what we all need today. Open all doors for them".

Having arrived home, I could not come to my senses for a long time, and understand how great the mercy of our Lord is to people. He opened these doors, I could clearly see it again and hear it again! After this meeting, I visited three different military units and had meetings with different military. For this ministry, people who are faithful and dedicated to God are very much needed. Therefore, I ask you all to continue praying for our ministry.

And to you, as always, I wish God's blessing and remember that our work with you is not in vain before our Lord, who loves everyone.
