

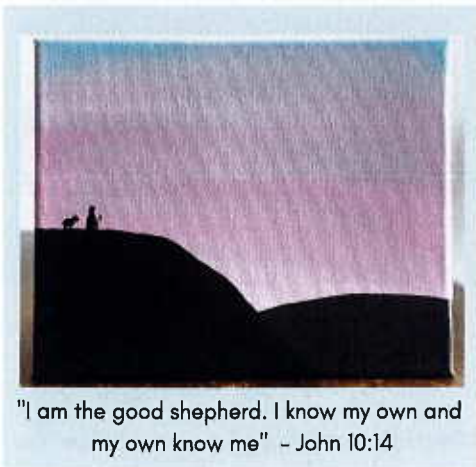
## A Time of Reflection and Transition
