God's Response: Titus 3:5 He (Christ) saved us, not on the basis of deeds which we have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit.

- 1. Sin has **always** been the separating factor from God.
- 2. It has always been <u>impossible</u> for people to reconcile themselves back to God, whether by good works, whether by obeying the Law, or by making all kinds of sacrifices. Our personal credit with God is bad!
- 3. The Law with all of its regulations and sacrifices could not bring salvation since mankind could not obey it completely. **James 2:10** It served to show us how sinful and in debt we really are.
- 4. As Job declared, "I know that my Redeemer lives!" That Victor first alluded to in Genesis 3:15, is described in detail in **Isaiah 52 & 53**, **Psalm 22** and many other Old Testament passages.
- 5. He was present as "The Angel of the LORD" in the Old Testament.
- 6. Salvation has always been by grace through belief and faith in Christ/Promised Messiah. The O.T. sacrifices could only **cover** sin until the Sin Bearer came to **cancel** all of the transgressions of those who would place their faith in Him.
