 - ★ IMPORTANT NOTE: <u>Sanctification/holiness</u> is the goal of being a slave to righteousness (1 Pet. 1:15; Heb. 12:14). The instruction manual for this is <u>God's Word</u> (John 17:17).
- I regularly reflect on what Christ offered on my behalf that I might have eternal life (Eph. 5:2; Heb. 9:28; 2 Cor. 5:21).
- ♦ I no longer <u>have</u> to <u>sin</u> since I have been set free from it (I Cor. 10:31; 4:7; John 15:5).

Question & Answer #1

Q. What is your only comfort in life and in death?

A. That I am not my own,¹ but belong-body and soul, both in life and in death $-^2$ to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ.³ He has fully paid for all my sins with his precious blood,⁴ and has set me free from all the power of the devil.⁵ He also watches over me in such a way⁶ that not a hair can fall from my head without the will of my Father in heaven;⁷ in fact, all things must work together for my salvation.⁸ Because I belong to Him, Christ, by His Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life9 and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for Him.¹⁰
