We are so hopeful that these students will meet the Lord in very personal ways in these two weeks.

Pray for the staff that are leading the program, that they would be energized and would have discernment as they make decisions for the group. Scripture to Pray:

During our last week of the semester, we reflected on the story in Joshua of the Israelites crossing the Jordan River on dry ground. In this story, God tells the Israelites to set up a stone memorial so that when the children ask what the stones are for, the elders can remember what God did at the Jordan River and tell the story of God's faithfulness. Joshua 4:5-7 says: "Each of you is to take up a stone on his shoulder, according to the number of the tribes of the Israelites, to serve as a sign among you. In the future, when your children ask you, 'What do these stones mean?' tell them that the flow of the Jordan was cut off before the ark of the covenant of the Lord. When it crossed the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. These stones are to be a memorial to the people of Israel forever.""

We reflected on this story and then had a chance to practice the discipline of remembering. We spent time remembering what God has done this semester, this school year, and for the seniors, over the last four years of their college career. We want to be faithful to remember what God has done for us, so that we can be reminded of His goodness and serve the Lord forever.

Would you pray that we would continue to practice the discipline of remembering? Pray that we would take the opportunities in front of us to remember God's faithfulness and tell stories of His goodness. Pray that the Lord would bless our remembering and draw us close to His heart and create in us a desire to serve the Lord forever.
