### ESSENTIAL TAKEAWAYS:

1. We need to be faithfully scattering seed (v. 26), which is the Word of God (v. 14).
2. We cannot cause any growth. God does the growing (vv. 27-28).
  - ◆ Much growth is hidden from us.
  - ◆ We cannot manufacture a genuine response or real change in anyone.
  - ◆ God's work does not encourage in any way laziness, apathy, or inaction on the part of the believer.
  - ◆ We must escape the idea of personal accomplishment.
3. Patient faith is required (vv. 27-28).

◆ We pray to be participants in what God is growing.

4. God uses humble beginnings to bring about unexpected results (vv. 30-32).
